Approximately 200 total hours (14 weeks), February 10, 2020 – May 15, 2020

DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES

The Programming Intern will facilitate the museum's spring 2020 Spring Break programming and KC Urban Advantage programming, as well as assist with other programming projects as needed.

Spring Break programming will run weekdays Monday, March 16 – Friday, March 27, 2020 and will consist of drop-in interactive workshops for our multi-generational audience. The Programming Intern will oversee the logistics and facilitation of the daily programs, interacting with visitors of all ages and creating an engaging learning experience that adds value to the visitors' time at the museum. Time commitment required: 40 hours during the intern's university-sanctioned Spring Break; hours for the other week of programming will be determined by the intern and Museum Educator.

The Programming Intern will also facilitate KC Urban Advantage museum visits for local school groups during March – May 2020. The intern will be responsible to greet each visiting group and assist them with educational programming during their time at the museum.

Additionally, there may be opportunities for the Programming Intern to be involved in further programming projects as needed, creating a well-rounded experience in the museum education field.
